#### THE POSTMASTERS' STAMPS

1848 to 1863

From 1818, Postmasters were permitted to retain any Postage Paid at their respective Offices on inland mail. In 1842 the rate was reduced to 1d. per ounce for letters, to be prepaid. A slot was provided for mail to be posted with the necessary sum for postage, should it be required to post any mail when the Post Office was shut. Unfortunately for the Postmaster the money and the number of letters did not always tally, and being required to forward all the mail, and rather than penalize those who had been honest, some mail would be sent post free. This also of course resulted in the Postmaster being cheated of part of his income.

It was to counter this fraud that in 1848 Mr. William Bennet Perot, Postmaster at Hamilton (1821 to 1862, at first unofficially) introduced his stamps, possibly influenced by the United States Postmasters' Provisionals. He produced them by utilising his datestamp (PM4) with day and month slugs removed and endorsing them with "One Penny" and his signature. He impressed them on sheets of paper which were later cut up as required, probably after being sold to those who wished to use them. These would be accepted at Hamilton as prepayment when affixed to local mail. A total of all the examples, of all dates of this first Perot issue only comes to eleven, five being in black and six in red.


In later years Mr. Perot used his Crowned Circle General Post stamp (P2), similarly struck on paper and separated. This is known on overseas mail.

Circa 1860 Mr. James H. Thies, Postmaster at St. Georges (1860 to 1879) introduced a similar stamp, also produced by using his Crowned Circle General Post stamp (P2).

This is one of three known and is the right-hand example of a pair discovered in 1934 among the papers of John Harvey Darrell, Chief Justice of Bermuda. The pair was separated in 1934 and both copies were sold at auction by H. R. Harmer in that year. This example was later acquired by Major T. Charlton Henry before passing to the present owner. The left-hand copy of the pair was acquired by His Majesty King George V and remains in the Collection of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

Post Office requisition October 1862 called for "3 doz. Crayons red and blue for taxing letters" and an appended note said "Crayons for taxing letters are found to be better for that purpose than ink and not more expensive".

It may be perhaps assumed therefore that Postmasters' stamps were so cancelled after this date. These stamps would be therefore "R. Ward" Postmasters' stamps as he succeeded Perot in June 1862.




